


External Threats to Manufacturing

Manufacturers need to be more resilient now than ever before. In March 2020, the novel coronavirus pandemic challenged manufacturers around the globe. But Covid-19 is far from the only threat on the manufacturing horizon: Natural disasters, political instability, supply disruptions, raw materials shortages, labor changes and economic uncertainty are just a few of the potential disruptors manufacturers face.
